

- 8.30 Gates open

- 8.40 9.00 Register and morning activity.
- 9.00 9.55 Whole class session followed by free flow activity and tasks as appropriate
- 9.50 10.30 Phonics lesson
- 10.30 -12.00 Short whole class session followed by free flow activity and tasks as appropriate
- 12.00 1.00 Lunch
- 1.00 2.30 Short whole class session followed by free flow activity and tasks as appropriate
- 2.30 3.00 Story/songs
- 3.00 3.10 Prepare for home time.

Parent School Partnership

Your input is incredibly valuable to your children as they begin the school journey, and we value the sharing of information to promote a positive learning partnership. We use many strategies to inform you about your child. We send regular updates of weekly work and events through parent mail, Facebook and on our learning platform ARC pathway. Each half term, parents are invited to spend an afternoon with us in school to join in with activities and see the children in action. In the autumn and spring terms, we hold parent consultations to discuss progress and share next steps for the future. At the end of the year, children receive a report which summarises their development and assesses the children in each of the 7 areas of learning. We actively encourage you to share/send in events and achievements to help us build a rounded picture of your child's development. We also hold an open-door policy and will always make time to chat with you and answer any questions you may have.

Early Years Framework



 The Early Learning Goals (ELGs) are the goals or targets children are expected to achieve at the end of their reception year. They are not the curriculum, but an end point measure of what a child should be demonstrating at the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage. There are 17 ELGs across the 7 areas of learning.
